PHONE APPS

MTV's "Over the Line" App (FREE | iPhone/iPad only)

This app allows teens to share their stories about being bullied, harassed or disrespected by peers. Other users can then vote on whether their peers were over the line, under it or hanging right around it.

Liz Claiborne's Inc. "Love is Not Abuse" App (FREE | iPhone/iPad only)

This app is an educational resource for parents that demonstrates the dangers of digital dating abuse and provides much needed information on the growing problem of teen dating violence.

Mary Kay/Loveisrespect.org: Dating Abuse Text Message Helpline (Regular text fees apply.)

The "loveisrespect" text message helpline is available throughout the United States 24 hours a day, seven days a week. By simply texting "loveis" to 22522, teens and young adults will be connected, safely and anonymously, to trained peer advocates who provide support, safety tips and referrals.

Safe It Up App (FREE | iPhone/iPad only)

This app allows users to set up check-in alerts for themselves or others. If a check-in is missed, an alert message along with the monitored individual's location will be sent to the predetermined contacts advising them that a check-in has been missed and that the monitored individual may require assistance.

Provider Resilience App (FREE | iPhone/iPad and Android)

This app gives healthcare providers tools to help prevent burn-out and compassion fatigue as they help service members, veterans and their families.

"Circle of 6" App (FREE | iPhone/iPad and Android)

This app allows users to select five contacts from their address book to create a "Circle of 6" supporters. There are three situations where SMS notifications are sent to your Circle of 6 and one emergency where the Love is Respect and RAINN hotlines can be called automatically.

One Love My Plan App (FREE | iPhone/iPad and Android)

This app has been created to help college-aged women and their friends learn about healthy and unhealthy relationships. It also provides personalized information and resources.
