If you have not done so already, do not forget to register for the SAT and/or the ACT. Registration information is available in the school counseling office or you can register on-line (www.collegeboard.org for the SAT, and www.act.org for the ACT). The cost for the SAT is \$47.50 and the cost for the ACT is \$50.50. SAT test dates for next semester are March 9th, May 4th and June 1sth, June 1sth, June 1sth, June 2011-13th, June 20

Please keep in mind that registration deadlines are approximately one month prior to each test administration. **REGISTER EARLY!**

If you are on free or reduced lunch, you qualify for test fee waivers. Sign up to see your counselor for forms and more information. Please keep in mind that you WILL NOT be able to use waivers once you graduate from high school, so please plan accordingly.

All prospective student-athletes intending to enroll in an NCAA Division I or II institution for the first time must complete the NCAA Amateurism Certification questionnaire. If you have used a fee waiver for either the ACT or SAT, you qualify for a clearinghouse waiver. Please **see Mrs. Jackson** in the counseling office once you have completed your online application. March "To Do" List

- 1) Complete/submit the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) https://studentaid.ed.gov/sa/fafsa if you have not already done so.
- 2) Be sure to stay on top of important financial aid deadlines.
- 3) Follow-up with your college financial aid administrators on your status.
- 4) Read all correspondence received from your college prospects.
- 5) Review your Student Aid Report (SAR) from FAFSA for accuracy.
- 6) Resist "senioritis" since all acceptances are "conditional" and reversible.
- 7) Begin to look for summer work, internships, and travel opportunities.
